They provide bicycles to the Chicago area as well as to the Gulf Coast, Ghana, Tanzania, Angola, Cuba, Guatemala, and Peru. This is an important contribution because in some countries, such as those previously listed; a bicycle can often mean the difference between work and unemployment.
